You're invited to join the swarm!

There will be a huge Buzz in the City when around 40 giant bee sculptures land in Chelmsford for 10 weeks in the summer of 2025, and we would love you to 'bee' part of it!

The brilliant bees will be installed outside places of interest. Each one will be decorated with a unique design by a talented local artist, forming the Buzz in the City art trail through the city centre.

An integral part of the art trail will be our Learning and Community Programme, where mini bees designed by schools, youth groups and community groups like you, will become part of the swarm, displayed around Chelmsford for everyone to admire and enjoy. Your mini bee will be yours to design, decorate and name, so it will be completely unique to you. After the trail it will be yours to keep as a lasting memory of your involvement in this high-profile art event.

Farleigh Hospice invites you to join the swarm and decorate your own mini bee, while raising money for local hospice care.

Benefits of bee-ing involved

When our swarm of bees arrives in Chelmsford it promises to be an exciting and popular event. There are lots of benefits to getting involved in our Learning and Community Programme, including:

- Participants will have the opportunity to learn in a creative, engaging and inspiring way – they will learn about nature and the importance of the bee in our ecosystem while creating their unique piece of artwork
- Everyone taking part can enhance and showcase their artistic and creative skills by coming up with a unique design, name and personality for your mini bee
- Inspire children, young people and adults to use their skills and talent to express their imagination to create

a work of art. Painting is also an excellent outlet for people to express themselves through nonverbal means

- Community engagement through the display of your mini bee as part of the high-profile art trail, which will attract thousands of visitors throughout the summer
- Connection to this new and exciting event for Chelmsford, which will positively contribute to the economic, social and cultural life of the city
- Association with Farleigh Hospice, a much-loved local charity. Your support will help us to keep caring for those facing life limiting illnesses and bereavement in our community.

How it works

Register now to secure your mini bee. The deadline to join the swarm is Friday 28 February 2025. There is a limited number of mini bees available so we would encourage you to register early so you don't miss out on this unique opportunity.

Funding your mini bee

To be part of the Learning & Community Programme, it will cost £650 (plus VAT) which covers the cost of the mini bee sculpture and its installation as part of the art trail. In addition to this, you will need to cover the cost of the paint and varnish to decorate your mini bee. The use of water-based acrylic paints is recommended, plus two coats of this varnish **www.urbanhygiene.com/ product/anti-graffiti-coating/**

The cost can be covered by fundraising to raise the money, covering the cost from your school's/group's budget or by sourcing an individual or business to sponsor the sculpture on your behalf.

As well as your mini bee, you will receive the following as part of your package:

- A certificate of ownership to display at your premises
- A Learning Resource Pack with activities and templates


- A fundraising toolkit, if covering the cost in this way
- Your name displayed alongside your mini bee as part of the art trail
- Inclusion on the Buzz in the City website and mobile app
- Your mini bee displayed at the Farewell Event
- After the trail, your mini bee will be returned to you to keep as a lasting reminder of your involvement in the art project and as a unique piece of art to be proud of.

For an extra £250 (plus VAT) you can choose to bring in one of our artists to run a workshop and assist in the painting of the mini bee sculpture.





What happens when? The timeline



You are invited to get involved (there is a limited number of mini bees so register early to avoid disappointment). get creative It's time to design and decorate your mini bee sculpture and/or host an artist's workshop. Your sculpture will form part of the mini bee swarms that will be displayed on the art trail at various locations across Chelmsford. This is your last chance to see all the bees (mini and giant) together. Your mini bee sculpture is returned to you to keep.





Arrival of your mini bee



Your mini bee sculpture will be provided ready for you to decorate and create a unique piece of art. The mini bees are a smaller version of our giant bee sculpture measuring:

Height: 75cm Length: 92cm Width: 71cm
